Reader's Message

"If you can keep your head, when all about you are losing theirs..."

Writing in mid March, this opening line of Kipling's poem seems particularly apt, as confusion reigns in Westminster and nobody knows where the country will be when you read this piece in April. People hold strong views and *Network* is not the place to comment on the debate itself. But we can ask, "how do we cope with the uncertainty, when nobody knows what to do?"

Uncertainty is part of life, and, perhaps, coping with the constantly changing British weather gives us a measure of stoic patience. We talk about the weather and the constant battle between the Atlantic gales we dislike, and the high pressure that brings those wonderful calm sunny days. And it helps us.

Knowing some history also helps, reminding us that there is nothing new in life. Crises have always broken periods of peace. One lesson, which has been in my mind lately, is how King Jehosaphat in Jerusalem faced a powerful invasion that far outnumbered his defences. He went to the temple and cried out to God. ending his prayer thus, "We have no power to face this vast army. WE DO NOT KNOW WHAT TO DO. BUT OUR EYES ARE ON YOU." The attack failed as the invaders fought each other ... You will find the account in 2 Chronicles 20

A modern parallel is the summer of 1940. My father was serving under

Admiral Ramsay at Dover and I have a copy of a then secret order issued by the Admiral in June. It lists barely a dozen coastal batteries spread over some 55 miles between Margate and Hastings. There was little ammunition. Britain was virtually defenceless. No wonder King George VI called the nation to prayer twice. First in May 1940 before Dunkirk, and then in September at the height of the Battle of Britain. On both occasions we were remarkably rescued from disaster. Not because God was on our side, but because God opposes evil and true prayer aligns us with his will.

Few know, but there are many praying for our country today. In January, several of us joined some 4,000 others at the Wembley Arena for a day of prayer for the nation. There was a strong sense that God is shaking us out of our complacency and bidding us pay attention to Him rather than go on imagining that we can sort ourselves out without Him. He may seem absent but He hasn't forgotten us!

In the dark days of WW2 people took strength in Psalm 46...

"God is our refuge and strength....
He says, 'Be still and know that I am God'...."

Should we not now listen to what he has said?



When dialling 999 the Ambulance Call Handler will ask a series of questions and should the patient require a defibrillator the handler will give access details to the nearest AED.

It has been a typically busy and fruitful last month at Berkley, with the pupils supporting *Comic Relief* by wearing red, as well as a red nose and by making donations for this worthy cause.

The previous week, the children dressed up as their favourite book character as part of *World Book day* and also shared their favourite book extract with their classmates. We are also compiling a list of parental favourite reads when they were aged 4-9, together with parental favourite quotes from books (My own favourite being 'To thine own self be true' from Hamlet)

We have had three *Wow! Days* in the last month: the first being a visit from Wessex Water who made pupils aware of this precious commodity and how we can make the most of it; the second involved the children learning about our new sponsored child from Ethiopia – an 8 year old girl and the third involved 'Pete the Poet' regaling the children about matters related to *Comic Relief* (the day he visited).

Year 4's attended the *Pilgrim day* at Wells cathedral this week, which is a special day for them and is part of the process of the Year 4's leaving Berkley at the end of this year and moving on to the next chapter in their education.

The school has been visited by our SEP, (School Evaluation Partner) who looked thoroughly into the school's actions and progress and provided

positive feedback, as well as endorsing the actions in our School Development Plan.

The days are getting longer, and we're already over half way through the school year and as always it's flying by.

The whole school have been busy raising money for Challenge Aid. Money raised for Challenge Aid is used to create Schools of Hope in Africa and so far the children have been sponsored over for £700. The children aimed to walk two miles each day for a week so that they have a better understanding of what it is like for the children who have to travel this distance to fetch water for their families. All the children were thoroughly committed to reaching this target and many aimed to walk further each day to raise more money. My own daughter came home each day telling me I owed her more money as she had, 'done even more laps,' today!

Following on from the theme of giving and compassion the children are also doing 40 challenges for Lent. These link to the school's Christian values and encourage the children to carry out different acts of kindness ranging from giving people nice surprises, to helping other people clean up and sitting and playing with other children. Blackbird Class started this with making a list of things they were grateful for.

Year 4 children have undertaken the traditional 'Leavers' Pilgrimage to Wells with the children from Mells School. This year the children learnt about Bishop Bekynton, who came

from Beckington and was a Bishop of Bath and Wells in the 15th Century. They enjoyed mixing with children from other schools and shared a range of activities with them such as completing a blindfolded obstacle course.

Following on from the very successful STEAM week, Owls had a lovely trip to the quarry, and they are planning their own designs for the future of the quarry in 30 years time. Linked to the STEAM theme the whole school are eagerly anticipating their trip to *We are Curious* before Easter.

Lots of the children are looking forward to supporting the pre-school in their annual **Easter Egg Hunt** in the Easter break which promises to be a fantastic day. The Friends of Beckington school are also well on the way with preparations for the joint summer fete in June to raise money for both the school and pre-school.

We hope everyone has a restful Easter break and hope the weather continues to improve so we can all go on some nice walks to compensate for the chocolate we are likely to consume!

Standerwick, Berkley and Beckington W.I.

At our March meeting the famous artist John Nankivell spoke to a large audience of members with 5 visitors. He told us about his travels and showed us some of his wonderful pencil drawings. He brought more than a hundred of them with him. All quite large, some very large and all incredibly detailed.

He trained at Reading University School of Art and then moved to Wantage where he met and become friends with Sir John Betjeman. In 1970 he went to India with Lady Betjeman and 3 of her female friends to draw the temples there. The

temples were built with layers of stone at the bottom, then wood, then stone all lavered up without any cement. If earthquakes hit, generally the buildings shook, but did not fall, due to this construction. After that he travelled round Java for a year drawing the intricate carved panels in the Buddhist temples there. Temporary Change to Dispensary Opening Hours

The Dispensary will be closed between 1-3 pm during April and May, the revised opening hours during this time will be 8.30-13.00/15.00-18.30. Apologies for any inconvenience caused.

Chronic Disease and Medication Reviews Recall System Change All patients with one or several of the following chronic conditions are being recalled on a yearly basis, for one (combined) annual review.

The recall system covers patients with: Diabetes Mellitus, Hypertension (high blood pressure), Atrial Fibrillation, Chronic Heart Disease, Heart Failure, Stroke/TIA, Chronic Kidney Disease, Mental Health. Asthma or COPD.

Patients due for review will receive an appointment invitation letter by post. Please do let us know if you cannot make this appointment so that we can re-schedule it.

At the appointment the health care assistant will carry out different checks (e.g. weight, blood pressure, etc.) and in most cases take blood. Once this appointment has been attended, a doctor will review the test results and decide if a routine review appointment with the doctor or nurse to discuss the management of the chronic condition should be scheduled.

Please note that repeat prescriptions can only be issued if the doctor is happy that all these important checks have been carried out.



Rode and District Gardening Club

For our February meeting we were joined by Dawn Collins who shared the delights of the gardens at Stourhead where she volunteers as a Walks and Talks guide.

The gardens were laid out between 1741- 1780 around the artificial lake created by damming the stream. The design was inspired by the paintings of Poussin of classical landscapes and stories of Greek mythology.

The path round the lake gives views of the Pantheon and the Temple of Apollo designed to give emphasis to the beauty of the landscape. Other monuments were added, the Grotto, the Gothic Cottage, the Palladian bridge and the Bristol Cross.

There are trees from all over the world, many trees were planted when they were first introduced to the UK by plant-hunters and now are fantastic examples of champion trees. Californian redwoods, all kinds of pines and spruce from China and examples of rare trees from different parts of Europe. There are numerous examples of tulip trees and acers. Henry Hoare said "The greens should be ranged together in large masses as the shades are in painting: to contrast the dark masses with the light ones. and to relieve each dark mass itself with little sprinklings of lighter greens here and there." The planting, added to over the years, quarantees fantastic colour throughout the year and consequently many visitors. Luckily for us we live close enough to visit at any time and enjoy it throughout the year.

Our next meeting will be on Monday 8th April when we will welcome Marion Dale to talk on *Designing your Dream Garden*. All welcome.
