Beckington Drainage Review Update

June 2018

While I presented high level findings, collated by Beckington's Drainage Review Team, to the Public Inquiry Inspector (as part of the Redrow Phase II Appeal hearing), other residents gave their more detailed account of significant drainage issues and also explained these on the ground in Beckington during the Inspector's site visit.

October 2018

The Beckington Drainage Review Team met with Caroline Murray, Mendip District Council's Flood Risk and Land Drainage Consultant. Caroline had previously met with both Wessex Water and Somerset County Council to discuss Beckington and advised that the primary focus was now clearly on completing the missing elements of the 'Beckington Drainage Survey'. A holistic view of Beckington's existing drainage system would then be clearly established for the first time.

November 2018

Reports of severe surface water flooding in Goose Street during heavy rainfall were photographed.

February 2019

As the snow melted there was a ministream flowing from the fields near the A36 down and along the Warminster Road. (Photographed and videoed) N.B. Evidence of what happens on the ground i.e. clearly showing where water is not draining away as it should, is always useful e.g. (i) when asking large corporate entities to spend huge sums resolving matters, or (ii) fighting future development in, or around, the village.

March 2019

Caroline Murray has recently confirmed that the remaining survey work for the completion of the existing Beckington drainage system has received funding approval and will be carried out in 2 phases beginning on 15th April. This is excellent news. (Those people with properties directly involved in completing this work will have already been directly contacted prior to this communication).



Fly Tipping

The dumping of waste (fly tipping) and dropping of litter is illegal and both are punishable by a fine. Mendip District Council is responsible for sweeping the streets and removing litter. The Council does not clear dumped rubbish or litter from private land, this is the responsibility of the landowner/tenant.

Every individual and business has a duty of care over their waste, even after it has left your home or premises, and failure to take reasonable steps to do this risks prosecution and a fine. If you or your business pay someone to take your waste away - whether by man-with-a-van, builder, gardener or other tradesperson - it is important to check if they have a waste carrier's licence. Ask to see the licence, and ensure you check where your waste will go. You can also go online to see if they are registered with the Environment Agency (call the agency on 03708 506 506).

Reporting it

Please use the online form to report dumped waste: www.mendip.gov.uk/streetclean or call 0300 303 8588 to make a report. Please note the Council does not clear dumped rubbish or litter from private land, this is the responsibility of the landowner/tenant.

If you have witnessed the illegal dumping of waste, do not disturb the site, there may be evidence that could help identify the culprits and lead to their prosecution. Please provide the following additional information:

vehicle registration

brief description of any vehicles

• brief description of the people seen fly-tipping

• photographic evidence if possible. If you find dangerous litter, such as an empty syringe, dog fouling, or a major spillage on a public road, please report it to us.

The last two weeks of the Easter term involved many extra-curricular activities, including our Years 3 and 4 pupils visiting Whatley quarry as part of our new STEM project that involves six local schools.

Berkley Years 3 and 4 children and Selwood Year 8 pupils have also been working together on a Drama improvisation, in which they explored what it must have been like to be an evacuee during World War II.

Just before the Easter break we held our Easter service, the content of which was planned by our Year 4 pupils and involved all the children in terms of singing, playing the recorders, making up prayers and acrostic poems, readings and art work.

We organised a special *Wow* day linked to the theme of Easter, whereby the children were vertically grouped and experienced six different activities including the washing of feet, the Last Supper, the garden of Gethsemane, Palm Sunday and general reflections.

Parents were invited to a Celebratory assembly where certificates were awarded to 100% attendees and to 'Good eggs' from each class.

Many children attended our Sunday family service; the school disco, which was run by the FBS (Friends of Berkley School), raised over £300 and on the final day, the school participated in a sponsored run to raise funds for cancer. This was part of the WHY? Charity (We hear you) and involved the children each running around the school field as many times as they could manage.

At our meeting in April members were given a report about our trip to Winsor Castle which was very much enjoyed in spite of the wet and cold weather. Several members are going to the Spring Road Show in Draycott where the speakers will be talking about Plastic Pollution and Marie Antoinette's Guide to Farming! Names are being taken for the trip to Camerton Gardens near Bath in June. This includes a tour of the gardens with tea, coffee and cake after. Under discussion is a Craft Morning to be held in October.

Our speaker, the psychotherapist Julia Samuel, then spoke about her work and book "Grief Works" dealing with people of all ages coming to terms with bereavement. Her book takes 15 people all coping with bereavement in different ways. In Victorian times people copied the Queen who wore black in memory of her husband. Black clothes were even rented out for the occasion. This all changed with the World Wars. Many people lost loved ones and there was no time to grieve properly. It was a case of having to survive, so little time to grieve. Julia's own mother lost many family members early in their lives. Only many years later when talking to her daughter, did she manage to properly grieve. Now it is realised that people need love and support from family and friends to grieve properly. People often say they feel that they have a hole in themselves when they lose someone. Often they cannot believe the loved one has gone and

still expect to see them. Pain and grief needs to be felt to come to terms with death not fight it and hide it. It is necessary to talk about people that have died, not shy away. You don't forget people that have died, you need to be able to remember them. Friends and family want to help, but don't know how. If you don't know what to say, listen instead of talking. Be honest, say you don't know what to sav. A bereaved person needs help in the future, such as a friend to go and have coffee with, or to go out with. Children should be allowed to go to funerals and told the truth. They make up much more frightening things if they don't know. They are not frightened if they are told what is happening. People are often reluctant to see a counsellor, but they should not feel this way. A lot of physiological problems are caused by deaths. This gives much food for thought. It is always difficult to know what to say to a grieving friend or relation.

The competition for "4 tulips grown in my garden" was won by Janet Cooke, and the raffle won by Angela Hill.

The next meeting on 2nd May is our AGM when resolutions will be discussed and we will have a quiz. PLEASE NOTE : - Our next meeting is in the CLIFFORD SUITE at the side of the VILLAGE HALL.
