Hymns have their stories

As a young man John Newton was press-ganged on board HMS Harwich. Eventually he became a slave-trader and was known for being coarse and immoral. It was during a severe storm in the Atlantic that Newton found himself praying for mercy. When the storm was over he began to read the Bible and some months later, as a result of what he read, he was converted. He left the slave trade and became a Church of England minister. He bitterly regretted his involvement with the slave trade and supported William Wilberforce in the cause for its abolition. He also began to write hymns, the most well-known of which is *Amazing Grace*:

*Amazing grace: how sweet the sound
that saved a wretch like me;
I once was lost, but now am found,
was blind but now I see.*

Newton knew that he could never make himself good enough for God but came to see that Jesus had died to rescue him. As Jesus said, 'I come not to call the righteous, but sinners'. Newton realised that Jesus died paying the penalty of his wrong and asked for forgiveness. This is what changed him and can change us too if we only ask.

Community Grants Money:

Beckington Parish Council is delighted to confirm that it has just awarded the Network magazine a community grant of £50 to help towards its costs.

The Parish Council is also keen to invite other local organisations to apply to its community grants pot. The Council has a set aside pot of money for the benefit of local groups, the application form can be downloaded from the Parish Councils website, it is not overly burdensome.

Planning Application Process:

The Parish Council has over the last year streamlined how it responds to many of the Planning and Tree works applications it receives from Mendip District Council. Not every application goes before the Council at a formal meeting (often the deadline for response to the application is before the next scheduled meeting anyway). It is important that if you wish to make a comment to the Parish Council with regards to any application that you contact the Planning & Development Portfolio Holder (All contact details are on the Parish Council website) as soon as you become aware of the application.

It is worth noting that it is Mendip District Council which is the Planning authority and so has the power to determine applications, not the Parish Council. Residents should make formal approach to them as well.

Local Council Award Scheme:

The Council has resolved to register for this scheme and work towards foundation level. Fewer than 20% of the Town / Parish Councils in Somerset have achieved this, so it would be setting a good standard if the Parish Council was to be awarded it.

The pupils learnt a great deal about Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths from the many firms that came along to explain their businesses and the feedback from pupils, parents and staff has been tremendous.

Author Steve Clifford spent a day with us in June, culminating in him signing copies of his books for the children. Steve tailored his presentation to the age-range of his audience and he taught them a great deal about the art of writing stories.

David Warburton, the local MP for Frome, spent a morning in the school and was very complimentary about the success of the school and the dedication of all the staff.

There have been many sporting festivals organised for both Key Stages and of course all the children and parents are looking forward to our Sports day coming up very soon, with a Community morning arranged for parents on the same day. Pupils and parents will also have a picnic on the lawn, hopefully with some live music from some Selwood musicians.

There have been more clubs on offer this month, including Country Dancing and Tennis.

The governors have also completed their final monitoring visit of the year, combining lesson observations, pupil interviews and work scrutiny.

Finally, I am in the process of working with more able pupils across Years 2-4 to write a story set at Berkley school. Hopefully, I can share an extract from their writing in the next and final article of the school year.

Beckington School

At the beginning of June we went to Kidzania in London. It was a long day for all the Y3/4 children, but judging from the enthusiastic discussions they continue to have, it was worth it! Kidzania is an indoor 'city' where children can choose from a huge array of jobs to experience. They had a fantastic time being police officers, window cleaners, pilots, fire crew and many more roles. Meanwhile, we invited all the children in reception, and years 1 and 2 from Mells, to enjoy a shared experience at Beckington organised by 'Clever Cogs' who set up 4 areas of work for the children to role play in: police, vets, palaeontology and a building site.

We also devised a transition event for the Y4 children: a STEM Fair held at Selwood Academy. At the exhibition each child from 6 local schools had a 10 minute STEM demonstration from 9 different exhibitors: over 90 minutes of STEM inspiration each! The exhibitors showcased local STEM companies as well as stands run by A-level children from the Science and DT departments of Frome College. Selwood STEM ambassadors also led an activity. The quality of the exhibitors was outstanding. Children observed cheek cells under microscopes, were awed by elephant toothpaste, flew aerodynamic planes, created paper towers, examined renewable energies, balanced water droplets on pennies, moved unmoveable objects, created mechanical sequences and delved into the workings of a quarry! What a morning!

We have enjoyed further sporting activity:

- a team took part in the English Gymnastics Schools Championships in Stoke on Trent, representing Beckington in the under 9 category. They finished in a very respectable 6th place – well done to Valentina, Amelia, Ruby and Elsie;
- our Y2 children took part in a sports challenge event at All Hallows School where they enjoyed trying new things along with lots of children from other schools;
- two teams took part in the quad kids Frome Area Athletics competition where they all tried their best in four different events;
- 16 children took part in the Somerset Schools Gymnastic event where they performed brilliantly to a very high standard;
- finally, we had been practising hard for the country dancing festival in Wells this year – unfortunately this event had to be cancelled because of the rain, but we hope to perform some of our dances, as well as the maypole, at our forthcoming **summer fair in Beckington on 30th June.**

Thank-you to everyone who has helped or volunteered at Beckington School this year – your support is much appreciated. We wish all our Y4 children every success and happiness as they start their new adventures – and you, a wonderful summer.

Standerwick, Berkley and Beckington W.I.

Our speaker for our June meeting was Mr Dando who talked about the wonderful Somerset Carnivals. He also brought with him several costumes he had used, all beautifully made with attention to detail.

The carnivals began in 1605 after Guy Fawkes gunpowder plot. It began with a large bonfire and a procession through the streets. There were no street lights, so people carried torches. This evolved later into the squibbing torches used in Bridgewater. A farmer volunteered to lend his hay cart and now the lorries are called carts. Mr Dando and his wife started helping with the carnivals when he retired. There are many families involved with the carnival as they see how enjoyable it is, and how everyone of all ages can take part. There are several different classes: musical, comedy, tableau, children's and also walking entries. For the tableau you cannot move for 2½ hours. Imagine balancing and leaning over for that length of time! The carts are 100ft long, 16ft high, 10ft 6" wide and weigh 50 tons. Children are encouraged to join in and they forget about their mobile phones. Many different skills are needed and are passed on to new helpers: apart from building the sets (still and moving), painting, lighting, music, engineering, electrical, planning the layout, and costume making and design as well as marshalling on the night. They received a grant from the lottery to buy an exhibition van. This they take to schools to show all the things

involved. One 14 year old girl then planned a Harlequin themed cart with details of the costumes and materials - very good and used for one of the carts. The Ghost Ship cart with all its moving parts cost £35,000 to make. On the Queens' Diamond Jubilee the members sent a DVD of the Carnivals to the Queen, and they received a letter of thanks. A very interesting talk showing just how much work goes into making the carnivals the success they are. They give so much pleasure to so many people and raise much money for charities.

4th July the talk is "Inspired by Fashion" by Professor Wendy Dagworthy who was a teacher at St Martins College, London.

1st August a Social Evening with a curry supper. One of our members will tell us about her son's wedding to a Sikh lady and she will be bringing the dress she had for the occasion.

5th September a Belly Dancing Experience with Audience Participation!?!

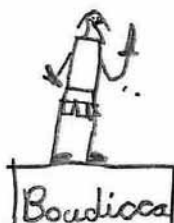

We were pleased to welcome Sue Martin as our speaker at the June meeting, in place of Rev Clarissa Shawnotice who was unable to come. Sue and her husband Bishop Rob Martin have spent several years ministering in Kenya and are well known to us now in the Frome area.

Sue's talk and the subsequent discussions led us to compare and contrast the role the Mothers' Union plays in church and community life, and the challenges the members face in each of our two countries. Members in Kenya face the day to day difficulties of living in a patriarchal society, where 85% of the population are illiterate. The country suffers with drought and famine, there is little clean drinking water, poor nutrition and health care, and instability caused by cultural differences and tribal clashes.

The challenges we face in the UK are of a different nature, but give cause for

concern for our lives now and in years to come. We see the effects of social media, advertising, the use of drugs, broken homes and dysfunctional families, homelessness and lack of respect. Our MU members are increasingly elderly, whereas in Kenya and many countries overseas, most are young mothers for whom MU is a means of support and friendship, with opportunities for accessing literacy, health care and self-help. There was much food for thought, followed by a lively discussion after Sue's talk, continuing over tea, and it is good to know that much of the money we raise helps to fund projects which can improve the lives of our fellow members.

The next meeting will be the last before the summer break, and will be cream teas for the **Summer of Hope Appeal**. This will be at Lahe Place on Wednesday 3rd July. We hope our mission partner Julia Birkett will join us. Please come and enjoy tea and a chat with friends.

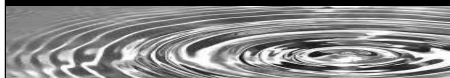
