What is a Lasting Power of Attorney?

Many of us know that it is important to write a Will, but fewer of us have considered making a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA).

An LPA is a legal document in which you can appoint trusted individuals (such as your relatives, or friends) to make decisions on your behalf, known as your 'Attorneys'. There are two different types of LPA:

Property and Affairs

This LPA will allow your Attorneys to help you manage your money, property and finances, for example. They can pay your bills and transfer, or invest your money for you. You can tailor the LPA to give as much, or as little, power as you would like to.

Health and Welfare

This LPA will allow your Attorneys to make decisions about your health and care; which may include what medical treatment you receive and where you live, etc. If you are capable of making those decisions yourself then your wishes will be paramount, and your Attorneys will be permitted to liaise with medical professionals etc. in relation to your needs.

Delights of Lullington 55: Bonfire time

It's a clear evening in early spring. Dusk is thickening very slowly. Occasionally, a great blast of wind from the west rushes past, hooshing the bonfire into action and scattering the smoke away over the fields. But mostly the fire ticks along peaceably, giving out a few crackles deep in the mound of briar rose and apple and yew and hazel and ivy prunings. The smoke creeps out, sometimes towering straight up in the air and sometimes billowing about in confusion.

I could watch this for hours. And I do. Leaning on my fork as the sunlight fades around me, I listen to the blackbirds riffing away and two tawny owls hooting slightly testily at each other. The tractor and trailer from Laverton thunders past in the lane, still at its Sisyphean task of drowning the fields in dung. The last glints of sunlight fade away, and Venus appears over our house.

Meanwhile the pile clicks and hisses and flares and shifts and billows. From time to time I fuss about forking unburned strays of twig and bramble back onto the top. But mostly I stare. You can't hurry a bonfire. Well you can, I suppose, if you chuck some petrol on top and wait for the sheet of flame to roar out. However, this not only endangers your eyebrows and leaves a nasty whiff of chemicals – it's also against the whole magical spirit of the enterprise. A bit like adding Ribena to cider

Next morning, it's still plugging on. The embers have patiently digested and reduced the mighty mound to a tiny extinct volcano of ash and scorched fragments. In the pale light of day it looks rather pathetic. I rake it around and the whole thing disappears into the soil. All that's left is a blackened patch and a few whisps of grey dust. But for days afterwards the delicious scent of woodsmoke clings to my shirt and trousers and hair. Then they all get a good wash and I can look forward to next year's bonfire

Standerwick, Berkley and Beckington W.I.

At our **FEBRUARY** meeting Police Sergeant Rachel Clark gave us a very interesting and informative talk on our local police. She was accompanied by Police Community Support Officer Mike Storey. Rachel has a total of 23 police officers in her team. The local police office is over the Kentucky Chicken outlet, near Sainsbury's store in Frome. Her area covers Frome Town, Frome rural north, Frome rural south, Shepton Mallet town and Shepton Mallet rural. Mike with other PCSO's walk around the areas talking to people and they often tell him things that are very useful.. Mike cannot arrest people, but he can detain them. Police officers are on duty 24/7. If you want to contact the police either ring 999, or if not urgent 101, Police officers now have computers to be up to date with what is happening immediately. The body camera gives valuable evidence when someone is arrested. Also very essential is the body vest the police wear which is very heavy. Police can call on an armed response vehicle, or other forces if necessary. Fortunately there is not much knife crime in this area but drugs are a problem. Members of the police force make regular visits to schools to talk about the dangers of drugs. They also work with councils and housing departments to sort out antisocial behaviour, noise problems, mental health issues and off road biking. The helicopter can be helpful in looking for someone with dementia who is missing as well as anvone wanted by the police. A Police officer's shift is 10 hours.

In contrast, at our MARCH meeting Reverend Clive Fairclough told us about his two years as chaplain at St. Andrews church in Moscow. He and his wife really enjoyed their time there. British merchants built the church there in 1884, but it was closed in 1920. after the revolution of 1917. The merchants kept some of their valuables in the church, so those were taken. Also, the priceless organ was destroyed along with the stained class windows. The army set up a post in the church tower to watch the streets below. The services began again in 1991 and it is now a protected building. On the gates there is the rose of England, the thistle of Scotland and the shamrock of Ireland. The British Embassy is close by. Inside there is a bar called the Hammer and Pickle. Everyone knows that the bar is bugged, so watch what you say. Drinks in the bar and tickets to the ballet are very cheap. There are no parks in the city, they are outside with lakes and fountains. There are many statues all over the city including in the train stations.

Due to the current situation our meetings are unfortunately cancelled until further notice. When the situation changes I will send the information in Network and it will be available on our Facebook page.

Rode & District Gardening Club

Our March meeting started with a quick AGM when we were delighted to welcome Tracey Gardener as our new treasurer. We then enjoyed a talk on No Dig Gardening, postponed from last year. Stephanie Hafferty has been kitchen gardening with Charles Dowding, working for Cameron Mcintosh and worked at Hadspen House which has now become the Newt and is currently doing the vegetable garden for the Hauser and Worth Gallery in Bruton.

The idea of no-dig has been around for a while: students at Kew are encouraged to do the comparison by cultivating their plots half dug and half no-dig so they can assess the differences. National Trust kitchen gardens have gone over to no-dig methods. Essentially no-dig maintains the structure of the soil and allows organisms to transfer moisture and nutrients through to roots to establish healthy plants. The key to this is good compost spread on the soil in spring and left undisturbed, no digging it in. Any sort of compost, home made. mushroom, local authority, woodchip, manure as long as it is well rotted will work. A layer of 5cms should be enough for a year. This helps to maintain moisture and helps soil condition. Compost is gradually drawn into the soil by worms which helps with drainage on clay soils and will help bulk up lighter soils. Fungal networks, which are very site specific, are developed and lead to healthy soil and plants. Compost is the key with patience being needed to let material rot properly. Turning home made

compost heaps will speed up composting but left alone it will all rot eventually. For the impatient, hot composting bins will rot everything including food and bones.

Stephanie recommended sowing vegetables in modules indoors and planting out into the laver of compost. Beetroot, onions, leeks, salad onions can all be multi-sown with a few seeds in each module which will grow on to be harvested in a clump, producing more, smaller vegetables. Lettuce can be grown individually but harvested by picking single leaves from each plant which will be replaced in days maintaining a continuous supply. This can be sustained all year by sowing fresh plants about 4 times a year and picking fewer leaves from plants kept undercover in winter. Clearing debris from the beds will discourage slugs which don't like the compost surface. The layer of compost will prevent the growth of many annual weeds but perennial weeds should be excluded as much as possible. Stephanie uses environ mesh to cover crops to keep off pests.

From your Rector elect, Reverend Prebendary Ronnie Crossman

Dear Friends

As I write the world feels a very different place than it did just a few days ago. We are all living with the effects of Covid-19. I want you to know how much you are all in my thoughts and prayers at this time. I already feel part of you, although I have yet to meet most of you. My heart really is with you all as a community. I know you are all trying to find ways to support each other. My arrival in July seems a very long way away and even if we are still not able to exercise a public ministry, I shall be with you.

I also know many of you would like to know a little more about the person who will be joining you as their Rector, so I'll do my best to share a little of my story knowing there will be more to share once I've arrived.

I grew up in a small village just outside Exeter in Devon. Apparently from a very early age I used to "play churches" with my dolls and teddy bears by sitting them all up and holding pretend services! I even wrote sermons from the age of seven. (My mum told me this!). It was probably because my dad was a Diocesan Reader, and would travel to villages across Devon taking services and playing the organ. I would go with him and sometimes even pump the organ in the remote places with no electricity.

My childhood faith moved from play time to something very real when I

was ten.
That's when I started reading the bible for myself and started following daily reading notes. I remember my confirmation



being a really significant moment even though I was still only eleven. I think this is why I value the faith development and leadership potential in our young people. I was still a teenager when I felt called in a very real way to full time ministry.

As a student I attended a very large evangelical church in Exeter for evening worship and a smaller house church in the morning. I was a member of the Paramedical Student Christian Fellowship and Christian Union in Exeter University whilst I trained as an Occupational Therapist. Over the years I have had the privilege of experiencing many different church styles and denominations. I even worked for the Lutheran Church in Germany for a year.

I was ordained in 1993, priested in 1994. I have been a university chaplain in Bristol and Bavaria. From 2002-2010 I was team missioner in a large parish of around 27,000 in Portishead as we attempted to plant a new worshipping community on a very large new estate in a new school. I became vicar to the parish of

Highbridge in 2010. I worked very closely with the Baptist Church and we set up a foodbank and other support in the community.

Since September of last year I have been Diocesan Vocations Coordinator in Salisbury Diocese. This was a ministry to which I could bring a wide experience of churchmanship and to embrace the extensive theological views that make up our Anglican communion. I've always been involved with the local schools and what I have missed most in my current job is popping into a school to help out with breakfast, loitering in the staff room, leading worship and I even miss the banter of a governor meeting! When my diocesan post looked as if it would change. I decided to return to parish ministry and placed an application to Beckington Benefice.

Myself and my partner, Liz are very much looking forward to worshipping with you. We bring a chubby cat called Ariki and hope to adopt a puppy once we've settled in to our new home. We have an extensive family who live across the country many of whom we hope you will meet over time. We hope our home will be a place of welcome and look forward to getting to know you all.

In my daily reading this morning I stumbled upon a reading in Philippians that seems appropriate as we seek to share God's love with those around us, even at a distance. "Live your life in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ......stand firm in one spirit, striving side by side with one mind for the faith of the gospel, and are in no way intimidated by your opponents....."

Sadly our opponent at the moment is a tiny virus with a huge capacity to destroy. But it can't destroy our love and compassion for others. With our continued prayer in these difficult times.
