County & District Councillors reports:

Cllr Brooke reported that she is aware of £1.5m pounds of grant money available for green energy projects in the South-West region. The money can only be used to pay for feasibility studies for environmental projects. Capital to pay for the project itself would have to be found elsewhere. Potential projects could be wind turbines, solar power, hydro power. Wants to push ahead with doing the groundwork towards applying for a grant and to gain the support of the Parish Council. Cllr Brooke owns a paddock and is willing to donate part of it for locating a wind turbine on, the location being such that no one would see it. Funding to build it would have to be raised locally from businesses that were interested in having green energy.

Members felt that any feasibility study should look at all possible locations in the Parish and at all possible sources of energy. The Parish Council would need to put forward the sites. A call for sites will be put out on Facebook.

B. To receive the bank reconciliation and budget to date:

C. Appointment of Internal Auditor:

The Clerk recommended Nicola Duke, Clerk to Norton St Philip and four other Councils. Last year's auditor has been promoted in her full time role to Town Clerk and now has too much of a workload to do the audit again this year.

It was proposed by Cllr Winterbourne to appoint Nicola Duke, seconded by Cllr Kelly and resolved unanimously.

101 Parish Council Savings Account:

The Clerk had circulated possible options to members. The Nationwide Building Society has a range of saving accounts or the CCLA offers services to the public sector, but money saved with them is not protected by the financial compensation scheme.

The Council's current account pays 0.2% interest.

It was proposed by Cllr Kelly to open a 45-day saver account with Nationwide that pays 0.85% interest, seconded by Cllr Winterbourne and resolved unanimously.

It was proposed by Cllr Kelly that the report be submitted to Mendip District Council as the Parish Council's formal response to the Sites and Policies consultation on the proposed main modifications, seconded by Cllr Winterbourne and resolved unanimously.

Promoting Safe Cycle:

Cycle Training: Cllr Fox reported that she had not been able to find any further information on cycle safety training, it is possible that the events that happened a few years ago were one off and there is no funding for them now. The County and District Councilors will be asked if they can find any information.

- MDC have congratulated the Parish Council on the wonderful job done at Webbs Mead and they had accepted responsibility for the ditch and will dig it out in the summer.

f) MDC Parish Forum & SALC Rep:

• Cllr Bishop has been attending the MDC Parish Forums, the new leader of the District Council also attends and gives a 20-minute question and answer session at each event.

g) Rudge Rep:

 Hope that after an intervention by the Parish Council that the post box will finally be replaced on land next to the Half Moon and not at Highland House as originally proposed by Royal Mail.
