A prayer when we are putting on our face covering....

Creator God, as I prepare to go into the world, help me to see the sacramental in the wearing of this cloth –let it be "an outward sign of an inward grace" – Let it be a tangible and visible way of living love for my neighbours as I love myself. Christ Jesus, since my lips will be covered, uncover my heart, that people would see my smile in the crinkles around my eyes. Since my voice may be muffled, help me to speak clearly, not only with my words but with my actions. Holy Spirit, as the elastic touches my ears, help me to listen carefully and caringly to all those I meet. May this simple piece of cloth be shield and banner, and may each breath that it holds, be filled with your love. In your name and in that love, I pray. Amen

At the time of writing, mid-November, mid-lockdown we don't know what Christmas will be like this year. We know it won't be like our usual Christmas. And we may feel deeply saddened. We may feel extremely frustrated. Yet into this chaotic, dangerous world came a vulnerable infant. The new-born didn't immediately appear to make a significant difference. Just a few weather-beaten shepherds were strangely drawn to come down from the fields. They came to an outhouse, where goats and sheep and maybe a cow would normally sleep.

"What can I give him, poor as I am?

If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb,

If I were a wise man, I would do my part.

Yet, what I can I give him? Give my heart"

We are now getting used to wearing a mask. A mask to cover our faces to protect others and sometimes a mask to cover our emotions, to protect ourselves. There may be much that we shall miss this Christmas. But let us also embrace those precious heart-filled moments, of hope, of help and of love.

Beckington Baptist Church

During the time that churches were able to re-open after the first Lock down, under Covid-19 restrictions, Beckington Baptist Church was the only non-conformist church in the Frome area that re-opened and was meeting face to face. We hope when the second Lockdown ends in December that we will be able to resume our services which are held at 3-00pm.

We have attempted to make worship as normal as possible within the constraints of Covid-19, and have done so. Although unable to sing hymns, these have been pre-recorded for the service, with choirs singing the words, so a sense of worship has been established. The act of worship is based around a pattern of hymns, prayers, and a meditation based on the Bible Readings set for that particular Sunday; this provides material for Sunday worship and for meditation during the following week.

Bus Stop on Frome Road (above Stubbs Lane)

The Parish Council has commissioned work to have the full length of the bus stop cleared. While not the responsibility of the Parish Council, it has become apparent that Somerset County Council wasn't going to make it any sort of priority for them, so the Parish Council has stepped in and commissioned a good 'hack back' that should last a few years, at least.

New Village Consultation

Some may recall the 'Bettering Beckington' consultation carried out in 2016. The public meeting held that year, and resulting survey, gave residents the opportunity to say what they wanted the Parish Council priorities to be. Four years later, and most of the agreed projects have been completed, with the remaining few being budgeted for next year. So, the Parish Council has already started the process of identifying further projects, and held a drop in event back in October 2019 to generate ideas. The Council has now appointed a local consultant to manage the final part of the consultation, and a workshop of the council members took place in October (2020). The next step is for a second workshop to take place with some residents. If you would be interested in taking part in this, do contact the Clerk (all meetings take place via Zoom). It is hoped that by February the Council will have a document to be consulted upon. The project is being referred to as 'Bettering Beckington II' – very original!

Community Grants Money

The Parish Council has a community grants pot and local organizations can apply to it now. The money is available for the benefit of local groups; the application form can be download from the Parish Councils website; it is not overly burdensome. Simon Pritchard




Beckington Astronomical Society (BAS) www.beckingtonas.org

The map shows the night sky in the early evening of 21st December. I will just pick out a few things that may be of interest. Jupiter and Saturn have been appearing closer and closer in recent months and on this evening, they appear closer than since the conjunction in 1623. It will be 2080 before they are as close again. On the map they are low down on the mid right, almost on the Ecliptic, the dark line across the map. The computer has tried to print Jupiter & Saturn in the same space. The Ecliptic is the path of the Sun throughout the year against the background stars. Some find this confusing, but remember there are stars in the sky during the day, and, for example, on mid-day on

the 21st December the stars behind the Sun are those of Gemini Astrologers would say 'the Sun is in Gemini'. Neptune is also shown almost on the ecliptic line. Its magnitude is 7.6 so it cannot be seen with the naked eve. A scan of the area with good binoculars should show many faint stars, one of which is not a star. but the planet Neptune. Finally, there is a good 1/4 Moon ideal for seeing its craters with good binoculars or a telescope. It is disappointing that the society will not have its usual social evening for members this Christmas, but let's hope things will return to some form of normality in the New Year. With Best Wishes

Support for Somerset residents during lockdown

Help is available for anyone in Somerset who may need additional support during the second national lockdown.

Residents are reminded they can call 0300 790 6275 if they need any help themselves, or are concerned about relatives or neighbours.

Although the national restrictions and guidance on shielding are different this time, it remains really important for people to stay connected, and also keep active, particularly during the winter period.

Help and advice is available and phone lines are open seven days a week between 8am and 6pm to offer support with:

- Personal care and support including food and delivery of prescriptions
- Support for the homeless
- Emotional support if you're feeling worried or anxious
- Employment, skills and business advice
- Transport to medical appointments
- Waste collection and disposal

Stepping Stone Placements

More homes are urgently needed in Somerset to provide vital support to young people as they move from care into adulthood.

With more than 300 young care leavers in Somerset, currently the demand for placements far outweighs availability.

'Stepping Stones' providers receive a weekly fee, starting at £185 per week, plus a little extra for food and utilities (up to £27.50) paid weekly by the young person from their allowance. Providers are also eligible for the same tax exemptions and relief as foster carers, but have much more flexibility to work full or part-time alongside their care role.
